From Andy's Desk...

This Sunday is Palm Sunday, where we remember the day Jesus rode into Jerusalem on a donkey with the crowds cheering him on, laying palm branches and their cloaks on the road in front of him. They welcomed him like a king and it is clear from what they said that they were expecting to see the beginning of a new kingdom with a new king from David's line on the throne.



"Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in

the name of the Lord! Blessed is the coming kingdom of our father David!" Mark 11:9-10

It must have been utterly thrilling for these Jewish men and women; and yet they had missed something critical. They had missed something that the disciples themselves didn't understand until several weeks later, after Jesus had been crucified and raised to life again, and Jesus had sent the Holy Spirit to equip and empower them to take the good news of Jesus to the ends of the earth. They missed just what kind of King Jesus was, and what he had come to do. Many of them expected a conqueror who would throw out the Romans and establish a global kingdom with Christ on the throne, and the Jewish people firmly on top.

Mark shows us that Jesus had something very different in mind. Mark answers two key questions ins gospel: Who is Jesus? Why did he come? In chapter 8 we reach the climax of the first half of Mark's gospel as we hear Peter declare confidently "You are the Messiah." *Messiah* is the Hebrew equivalent of the Greek word *Christ*, and both words mean *God's anointed King*. Peter has drawn the right conclusions for all the evidence given by Jesus: Jesus is the King.

But what kind of king? What had God's King come to do? What follows shocks the disciples and the Jewish people.

"[Jesus] then began to teach them that the Son of Man (one of Jesus' ways of referring to himself) must suffer many things and be rejected by the elders, the chief priests and the teachers of the law, and that he must be killed and after three days rise again. He spoke plainly about this, and Peter took him aside and began to rebuke him." Mark 8:31-32

Jesus had not come to establish global rule with a sword and army. He had come to die, betrayed and rejected by the Jewish people and their leaders. The crowd that cheered Jesus into Jerusalem on the first Palm Sunday was replaced by a crowd baying for Jesus' blood less than a week later in the early morning of Good Friday. Jesus' death was a ransom (Mark 10:45), a wonderful demonstration of the love of God as Jesus gave his life to set us free from sin (Romans 5:8). Jesus died the death we deserved so that we might become children of God with all the rights of heirs as though we had lived the perfect life of Jesus.

And what does it mean to follow this King? As Jesus himself says: "Whoever wants to be my disciple must deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me." Following our King, we are called to a life of sacrifice and service.
