#### From Andy's Desk...

"What right does Jesus have to say that he is the only way to God?" Have you ever asked that question?

Some people think that Jesus' claims are arrogant and exclusive. In a world of many competing views why on earth should we believe Jesus? Aren't there lots of ways to know God?

Easter is the proof we need.

At the first Easter, Jesus was crucified by the Roman execution squad on duty

that Friday. These guys were experts in making people die horribly - and they made sure Jesus was dead.

Three days later, the first people to Jesus' tomb found it empty. Over the weeks that followed hundreds of people saw Jesus alive and well, and the authorities failed to produce any evidence to the contrary. Here is the Apostle Paul writing about twenty years later:

"For what I received I passed on to you as of first importance: that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures, and that he appeared to Cephas, and then to the Twelve. After that, he appeared to more than five hundred of the brothers and sisters at the same time, most of whom are still living, though some have fallen asleep. 1 Corinthians 15:3-5.

Notice that Paul says that most of the eyewitnesses were still alive - his readers could have tracked them down for themselves to ask them. In the years ahead some of these eyewitnesses were killed because they insisted Jesus had come back to life. In the gospels we have the eyewitness testimony of those people. These are ancient accounts written so that people through the ages could know the truth about Jesus. Even all the historians of the time, themselves not Christians, recorded that this was the news spreading like wildfire across the Roman Empire.

This is not just extraordinary. It also proves everything Jesus said about himself.

You see Jesus had said on many occasions that this is precisely what would happen. Here's Mark's gospel (8:31):

"He then began to teach them that the Son of Man must suffer many things and be rejected by the elders, the chief priests and the teachers of the law, and that he must be killed and after three days rise again."

Jesus predicted the manner of his death and the fact of his resurrection again and again. In fact, everything Jesus said proved to be true. Again and again, Jesus proved his credentials as God himself come to earth, and this came to an extraordinary climax when he came back to life three days after his execution, proving beyond doubt that Jesus is the Son of God and the king appointed by God over all his creation. When he says that there is no way to get to God except through him - you can believe him - his resurrection proves it!

In fact, Jesus is still living now, still doing business with people like you and me, calling us to follow him. Don't miss him.
